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CPR SAVES LIVES

Dan Bitler shares his story

On June 24, 2023, I was playing golf at Pipestone Golf Course in Miamisburg, when suddenly a golfer who was on the green ahead of us fell forward flat on the green. While others called 911, I drove my cart up to the green, and turned him over where I could not find a pulse. I decided I only had one option, and that was to start CPR chest compressions. After about 1-2 minutes of compressions, the golfer started breathing again, and his heart started beating.

The golfer, Rick, was brought to Kettering Hospital where it was found he had 100% blockage in one artery, and 99% in another. After some stints and with broken ribs, I learned that Rick was talking and recovering at Kettering ICU. I am ecstatic to share that he has recovered from his heart attack and is doing well.

Past Issues

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I was lucky enough to meet Rick while he was recovering the next day, and a month later at dinner with my family.

After speaking to Rick, both of us want everyone to take the time to learn the basics of CPR. After speaking to people in the medical field, here are some things I have learned.

- 1. All you have to do is compressions. No need for breaths. Just push to the song "Stayin Alive".
- 2. You are not going to hurt the person; they are already dead. If they are alive with a beating heart, they will respond to your chest compressions. Any attempt is better than nothing.
- 3. Compression depth on an adult is 2". If you don't break ribs, you are not doing it hard enough. You have to push hard and quick because you are doing the work of their heart and their lungs.
- 4. You will get tired, quick! One round of compressions lasts about 2 minutes. If help isn't readily available, do 2 minutes of CPR then go call for help. Return and resume CPR. If you have help, swap compressors when you feel fatigued.

I would encourage you to get Certified in CPR, but at a minimum, please check out the Red Cross's website on how to hands only CPR.
